
A Supplement to NWPB's Labour Market Planning Report

INDUSTRY, OCCUPATIONS & WAGES, 2017

In 2017 there were a total of **10,999** jobs in Lincoln. This is a **2.4 %** increase compared to 2016's count of **9,867** jobs within the municipal boundaries. Note: the data presented in this report reflect the jobs that are located in the Lincoln census subdivision (i.e.: within Lincoln's municipal boundaries).

As noted in Figure 1, the top three industries in Lincoln in 2017 were **manufacturing, health care and social assistance, and agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting**. The number of jobs in these industries makes up a total of **41.5%** of the jobs in Lincoln



Figure 2 depicts the top occupations in Lincoln by number of jobs in 2017. The top three occupations were **sales and service occupations; trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations;** and **business, finance and administration occupations**. These three occupations combined account for **51.1%** of the jobs in Lincoln.

Another factor of interest when analyzing a municipal labour market is its occupational compensation profile. For this report, we assessed the median hourly income of occupations in Lincoln. We converted this data into an annual income figure based on a 40-hour work week for a year (52 weeks). Based on these data, the **highest paid occupations** in Lincoln in 2017 were:

- **Management occupations**, with **593** jobs and a median annual salary of **\$77,124**.
- **Natural and applied sciences and related occupations**, with **450** jobs and a median salary of **\$67,544**.
- **Occupations in education, law and social, community and government services**, with **874** jobs and a median salary of **\$61,971**.

OCCUPATIONAL GROWTH, 2017

Table 1 outlines the four occupations that experienced the most growth in terms of number of jobs within Lincoln between 2016 and 2017. These occupations are ranked by absolute gains within each occupation, and the percentage represents how much growth that occupation experienced. **Table 2** provides historical data on the top five occupations, based on the number of jobs in 2017, to show how job counts have changed over a one-year, five-year, and ten-year time span.

JOB DEMAND IN LINCOLN, 2017

NWPB estimates job demand through the aggregation of public-facing, online job postings. Between January 1, 2017 and December 31, 2017, there were **291** job postings listed in Lincoln. The five most common occupations listed in Lincoln job postings can be found in Figure 3. The top three identified occupations in terms of demand were:

- **Sales and service occupations (35.4% of job postings)**
- **Trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations (19.2% of job postings)**
- **Natural resources, agriculture and related production occupations (13.4% of job postings)**
